

Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.



Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures:



#### **Nicene Creed**

#### A Word to Our Guests and Visitors about Communion at Praise







Build Project total cost estimate: 3 million (approximately 36% funded).

Gifts to the Building Fund now will help us delay borrowing. Please consider giving new funds or scheduled commitments for the build early to help delay interest payments.

Worship chairs: If you're asking, "What can I help fund?" we will need 116 new chairs in the same fabric and similar frame to complete the new Sanctuary. A manufacturer has been found and we are finalizing quotes and options. Cost is approximately \$100 per chair with shipping, etc. *Please specify: Worship Chairs with your gift*.

Corpus for the Cross Our Elders have discussed and approved an artistic and worshipful element as a centerpiece for the new Sanctuary. A new corpus will be made of wood and can beautifully remind us of the glory of Jesus' real presence on the cross and even now in our lives. "We preach Christ *crucified...*" (1 Cor. 1:23). The new corpus will complement and complete the themes of the upcoming stained-glass windows in the altar space. This has been generously funded by 3 member families

who independently asked if they could help provide funding for the corpus after it was announced as an item under consideration. Pastor will present more on the history, theology, and practice of Christian crucifixes and an upcoming Bible Study(ies).
