
A Word to Our Guests and Visitors about Communion at Praise







The new corpus will complement and complete the themes of the upcoming stained-glass windows in the altar space. This has been generously funded by 3 member families who independently asked if they could help provide funding for the corpus after it was announced as an item under consideration. Pastor will present more on the history, theology, and practice of Christian crucifixes and an upcoming Bible Study(ies).
