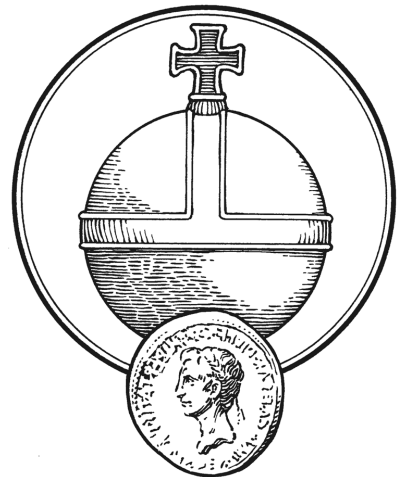
Holy Gospel

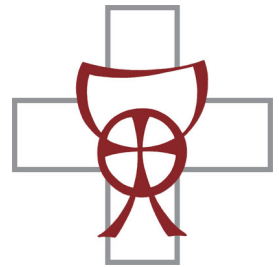

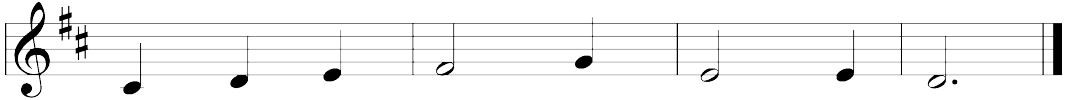
