Mercifully pardon our sins that we may obtain the promises You have laid up for those who are repentant; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Address for Imposition of Ashes

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" (God spoke to Adam, Gen. 3:19).

After receiving the ashes, return in silence to your place and await the Invocation.

The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.





congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet to desire to receive the Sacrament (Communion), are encouraged to seek guidance from the pastor.




