Holy (also known as Maundy) Thursday, occurring on the eve of our Lord's crucifixion, begins the celebration of the three holy days of Christ's Passover, commonly known as the *Triduum*. The service on this day culminates the Lenten period of preparation for Christ's Passion and Resurrection and leads into His sacrifice on our behalf. As such, the service, like that of Good Friday, exhibits a mood of restrained joy. The service concludes with the Stripping of the Altar.

Preparation

The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.

and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C Amen.

P Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. He who calls you is faithful; He will surely do it. Go in ✠ Peace. **C** Amen.

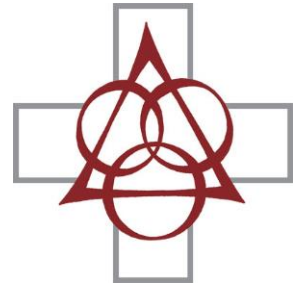
