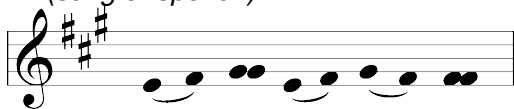
A Word to Our Guests and Visitors about Communion at Praise

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very Body and Blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death and resurrection until He comes. Scripture warns that those who come forward to eat and drink our Lord's Body and Blood in an unworthy manner do so to their great spiritual harm. The Lord's Supper is also a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar. Therefore, any who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet to desire to receive the Sacrament (Communion), are encouraged to seek guidance from the pastor.

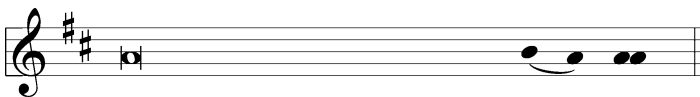

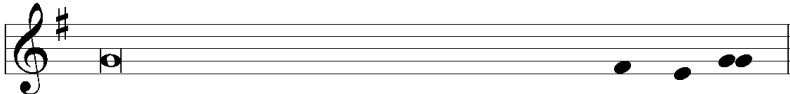

Build Project total cost estimate: ~ 2.8 million (approximately 36% funded).

Final 2 months of progress: Ceiling Lights (Sanctuary), Millwork, Altar area (rail, kneelers), Flooring, Fixtures, Landscaping and Signage, Final (top) layer of parking lot, stained glass windows (delayed until after occupancy).

Worship chairs: *Status:* \$11,600 (116 chairs) are fully funded, ordered, and should arrive later in March. Thanks be to God. *A grant from Faith Lutheran Church (LCMS) in Oak Ridge has been announced and is forthcoming. Thank you to Mark Yoder for helping submit the grant proposal and special thank you to our friends at Faith Lutheran Church where Pastors Chase Lefort and George Smith serve the parish and encouraged us to apply.*

Help Fund Wooden Beams for the new Sanctuary. The price of these were more than originally budgeted, these were deemed worthy to do now and an important architectural and meaningful feature.
